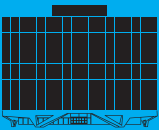

Otis prepares diverse students of art and design to enrich our world through their creativity, their skill and their vision.

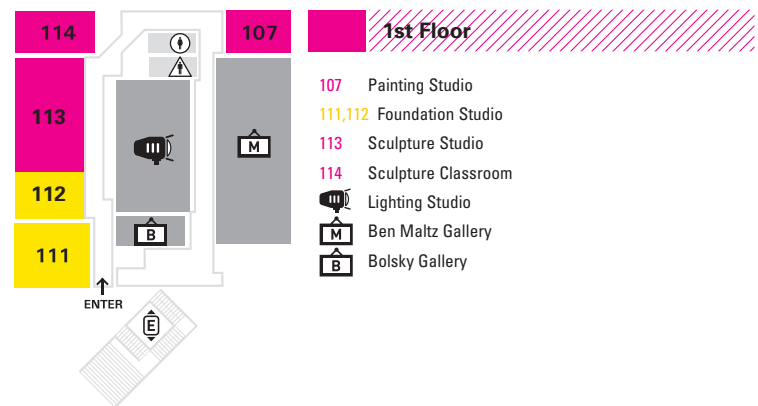
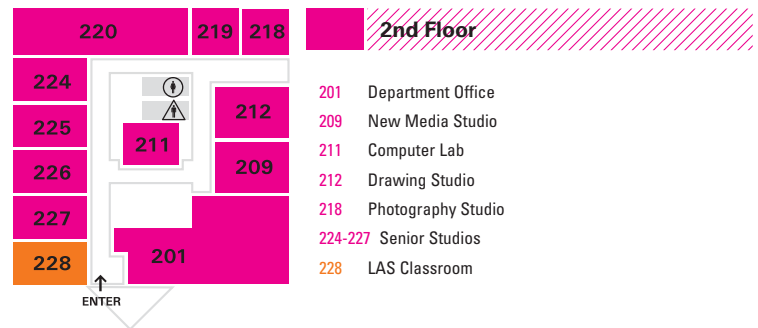

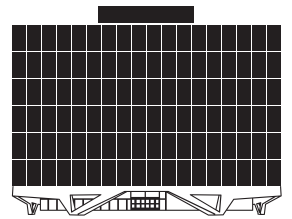

## Architectural History

Curious about those small windows? Kathleen Ahmanson Hall, designed by architect Eliot Noyes, opened in 1963 as IBM Aerospace Headquarters. It was built using a revolutionary modular construction method: 6x12 foot wall sections were built on the ground and then lifted by crane into place. The small, rectangular windows were inspired by the technology of the time: computer punchcards.

The building was purchased by Otis in 1995. Using the concept of a working studio, rather than that of a traditional classroom, the building was completely renovated by Bobrow Thomas Architects to become Kathleen Ahmanson Hall, the heart of Otis' new Elaine and Bram Goldsmith Campus.

In 2001, the Bronya and Andy Galef Center for Fine Arts opened. Frederick Fisher Architects designed its complex geometry and corrugated metal forms to contrast with the "punchcard" vocabulary of Kathleen Ahmanson Hall. Today, the Bronya and Andy Galef Center for Fine Arts serves as the permanent home of the Fine Arts Department, and Kathleen Ahmanson Hall houses the design departments.
