


The ImageViewer[®] Functions

Single Screen Functions

Move slide information around the screen by dragging it with the “Hand” icon.
 When the image is enlarged, click and hold the Hand cursor to drag the image on the screen.
 Center an enlarged slide by selecting Center from the drop-down menu.
 To access the mouse menu, right click (PC) or CTRL-click (Mac).

First slide	Home		<i>Go To Slide...</i> choose 1. slide
Last slide	End		<i>Go To Slide...</i> choose last slide
Any slide			<i>Go To Slide...</i> choose number
Zoom in	↑ Up arrow key	Move mouse to top side of screen; an arrow ↑ will appear. Click the mouse.	<i>Image Size</i> <i>Intermediate</i> <i>Actual Size</i>
Zoom in	Space bar (click mouse to set center point)		
Zoom out	↓ Down arrow key	Move mouse to bottom side of screen; an arrow ↓ will appear. Click the mouse.	<i>Image Size</i> <i>Intermediate</i> <i>Shrink to Fit</i>
Hide slide	h		<i>Hide Slide</i>
Unhide slide	h		<i>Show Slide</i>
Minimize slideshow			<i>Minimize Slideshow</i>
Show information	i		<i>Slide Information</i>
Hide information	i		<i>Slide Information</i> <i>Hide Info</i>
Split vertical	y		<i>Split Display</i> <i>Vertical</i>

Keyboard Commands for Split Screen

You can split a screen either horizontally or vertically; you can toggle between them.

Function	Left / Upper Frame	Right / Lower Frame	Both Frames
Split screen vertically			y
Split screen horizontally			x
Next slide	→ Right arrow key	SHIFT + →	CTRL + →
Previous slide	← Left arrow key	SHIFT + ←	CTRL + ←
Zoom in	↑ Up arrow key	SHIFT + ↑	CTRL + ↑
Zoom out	↓ Down arrow key	SHIFT + ↓	CTRL + ↓
Hide slide	h	SHIFT + h	CTRL + h
Unhide slide	h	SHIFT + h	CTRL + h
Hide slide information	i	SHIFT + i	CTRL + i
Unhide slide information	i	SHIFT + i	CTRL + i

The ImageViewer® Functions

Mouse Drop-Down Menu

Access this menu in any screen or frame by right-clicking the mouse (PC) or CTRL-mouse click (Mac).

Top Menu	Sub Menu	Explanation
Next Slide		Goes to the next slide in presentation
Prev Slide		Goes to the previous slide in presentation
Hide Slide		Hides the current slide in presentation, producing a black screen (i.e. imitates a blank slide)
Image Size		
	Shrink to Fit	Fits the image to the screen or frame
	Intermediate	Shows an intermediate size of the image; used in zooming
	Actual Size	Shows the actual size of the image; used in zooming
Center Slide		Centers the image in the screen or frame
Split Display		Splits the display into 2 frames
	Undo Split	Undoes the split
	Horizontal	Splits the screen into two frames, upper and lower
	Vertical	Splits the screen into two frames, left and right (i.e., simulates a 2 carousel slide lecture)
Slide Information		
	Show Info	Shows file name, creator, period, etc., in black lettering on a sold gray box
	Show Annotation	Shows instructor notes and comments about the slide
	Show Both	Shows both slide info and annotations
	Move to Upper Left	Moves slide info to upper left of screen
	Transparent Box	Makes the background of the information box transparent gray, instead of solid gray
Go to Slide		Lists by number & title the images in the presentation Click on a number to go immediately to that image
Minimize Slideshow		Minimizes the window
Go to Slide Menu		Returns you to the log in screen menu
Quit		Quits and exits the application
